

ENDURING CONSEQUENCES

As lockdowns intermittently softened and face-to-face activities began to cautiously resume, our office saw a resurgence of in-person services. Our community, like so many other communities around the world, was hurting.

Many families were living in the aftermath of the world-changing and socially isolating events of 2020: deterioration in emotional and mental functioning, economic struggles, domestic violence, substance use, anxiety, and depression, just to name a few.

501(c)(3)

Non-Profit Status

Family & Children's Counseling Services obtained 501(c)(3) status on October 28, 2020, meaning that 2021 was our first official full year as a "nonprofit organization." Our primary source of income as "fee for service" therapy and supervised visitation.

Fee for Service

Fee for Service means a provider is paid for a service rendered. In our case, we are paid for each therapy service or court- ordered supervised visitation service we provide. Our fees are appropriate according to industry standards, and we offer reduced fee, and pro-bono options.



Scholarships Given

As a non-profit organization, our Vision is to see a world filled with caring, connected communities and happy, loving families. To help promote the reality of our vision, we help families with reduce fee services and reduced fee educational opportunities.

Reduced Fee (Scholarship) Therapy Sessions

- 42 reduced-fee sessions worth \$80 / each \$3,360
- o 400 pro-bono sessions worth \$ 100 / each \$40,000

Total therapy scholarships given \$43,360

Educational Scholarships - Supervised Visitation Training Program

- 227 scholarships (60% discount) worth \$413 / ea. = 93,751.

Total educational scholarships given \$93,751
